WHY "ADAM'S RIB": Any film starring Spencer Tracy and Katherine Hepburn is a film worthy of being seen, regardless of whether it was mentioned as one of the greatest legal movies of all time, as this one was. Directed by George Cukor, the film is about a married couple who oppose each other in court. One of the co-stars of the film is Judy Holliday who in 1950 would win the Best Actress Academy Award for her role in *Born Yesterday*. In 1952, Ms. Holliday was called to testify before the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee to explain why her name had been linked to certain Communist organizations. In spite of her 172 IQ, she was advised to play "dumb," in keeping with her stage persona, which she did.
