

## MUHAMMAD ALI'S GREATEST FIGHT

**THE FILM:** In 1966, two years after winning the heavyweight title, Muhammad Ali refused to be conscripted into the military, citing his religious beliefs and opposition to American involvement in the Vietnam War. He was eventually arrested, found guilty of draft evasion and stripped of his boxing titles. He successfully appealed to the United States Supreme Court, which overturned his conviction in 1971.

Tonight's film sets forth the story of Ali's "Greatest Fight." The cast includes Christopher Plummer as Justice John Harlan; Frank Langella as Chief Justice Warren Burger; Ed Begley, Jr. as Justice Harry Blackmun; Danny Glover as Justice Thurgood Marshall; and Barry "Diner" Levinson as Justice Potter Stewart.

Join us for the "Greatest Fight" of a man, self-described as "The Greatest Of All Time" in the grand elegant setting of the Bar Library's Main Reading Room for a night to remember.
